

Acts2:39 "For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call."

2:40 And with many other words he testified and exhorted them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation."

2:41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them.

2:42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.

2:43 Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles.

2:44 Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common,

2:45 and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need.

2:46 So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart,

2:47 praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

From today's sermon.

This passage teaches us how much "receiving the Holy Spirit" means to us, to the church, and to missions.

Peter spoke powerfully about the meaning of the giving of the Holy Spirit and Jesus' resurrection from the dead through David's prophecy.

He emphasized that the words, "I will not leave my soul in Hades, nor allow your saints to perish," were David's prophecy, not for David himself, but for Jesus. For David was in the grave, and he was rotting away, but Jesus was not in the grave.

From the prophecy, "I will put one of his descendants on the throne..." and "The Lord said to my Lord, Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies your footstool," David, though a king, confessed his own descendant, the king, as his own Lord.

The Lord and King over David, the one whom David said would not be thrown into Hades and whose saints would never perish, Peter said, was Jesus, "whom God has set forth as Lord and Christ.

In the face of the piercing remorse of what he had done to the One, he told them to repent, be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, and be saved from the crooked and wicked age. Here is the only way to be saved from the crooked and wicked age.

Good morning everyone, it is now June. The weather is strange: hot outside and chilly inside, but it is very pleasant to go outside. The green is thick, the sky is blue, and it is not too humid yet, so I think it is a good season. I would like to exercise my body and not stay indoors.

It has already been three weeks since the miraculous Pentecostal event. The Holy Spirit poured out His Holy Spirit on each of the disciples in flaming tongues, and they were given tongues to speak, praising the great works of God in many languages they had never learned. And how many languages have spoken of God's great work through the redemption of Jesus Christ since then until today, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit!

And in the presence of many temple worshippers who flinched at this miracle, Peter spoke boldly, "Men of Israel, now is the time for you to be baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Hear now what I say to you, O men of Israel. For you know well that Jesus the Nazarene was the one whom God showed to you through him that he was God's handmaid, by his many mighty works and miracles and signs which he performed among you."

God has shown you through Jesus that you are God's handmaidens, through His many mighty works, miracles, and signs. And despite these signs and miracles, you did not accept Him. You crucified Him and killed Him at the hands of unrighteous people.

Your revered King David said of this Jesus in Psalm 16: "I have always seen the Lord before my eyes.

I have always seen the LORD before my eyes; I have seen the LORD in my heart, and I have seen the LORD in my soul. For the Lord is at my right hand, that I may not be moved.

Therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue sang with joy. And my flesh also shall live in hope.

Thou wilt not leave my soul in Hades, nor wilt Thou allow Thy saints to perish.

Thou wilt show me the way of life, and fill me with joy in Thy presence.

2:29 I can boldly say to you, brethren, concerning David the chief, "He is dead and buried, and is now in the land of the living. He died and was buried, and his tomb remains among us to this day.

Psalm 16

Song of the Michtam of David

16:1 Protect me, O God, and keep me. I will lean upon thee, and thou shalt be my strength.

16:2 I will say to the LORD, "Thou art my Lord; besides Thee there is no other blessing for me.

16:3 All the saints in the land are excellent people in whom I am well pleased.

16:4 About them that choose other gods shall increase in sorrow: for I am the LORD their God. I will not pour out the blood of their offerings, nor will I utter their name with my mouth.

16:5 The LORD is my inheritance, and my cup to fill. 16:5 The LORD is my inheritance, and my portion shall be mine to fill; thou shalt keep my portion.

16:6 The measuring rope has fallen in a favorable place for me. 16:7 And I have obtained a goodly inheritance: for thou hast spoken unto me, and I have heard the voice of thy voice.

16:10 For thou wilt not leave me in the shadow, nor let thy saints see the grave.

16:11 Thou shalt show me the way of life. 16:11 Thou shalt show me the way of life: in thy presence is fullness of joy; at thy right hand are all manner of pleasures for ever and ever.

The latter words of Psalm 16, "For thou wilt not leave me in the shadow of death, nor let thy saints see the grave. were not for himself. David died and was buried, and his tomb is still there to this day, his body rotting away and his bones in the grave. Who then is this Psalm 16 talking about?

Who is the Lord to whom "I will say to the Lord, 'You are my Lord, besides You there is no other blessing for me,'" and "I will set the Lord always before me. I will not be moved, for the Lord is at my right hand." And who is the Lord of whom David says, "I will not be moved, for the Lord is at my right hand. We know that it was Jesus who truly fulfilled the words, "You will not leave me in the shadow of death, nor let your saints see my grave," and that it was the prophecy and prayer that David received from God as he looked up to Jesus, trusting God for his salvation. Before David was Jesus. Since Jesus conquered death and did not abandon him to Hades, and since his valor will never decay, David also followed Jesus' example and said, "I will set the Lord always before me; I will not depart from him, nor forsake him. He confessed, "Because the Lord is at my right hand, I will not be moved.

2:30 For he was a prophet, acknowledging that God had firmly sworn to him, 'I will put one of his descendants on the throne,

2:31 Knowing in advance the resurrection of Christ, he said, “He will not be cast into Hades, nor will his body perish.

2:32 And this Jesus God raised up, and we all bear witness to him. And we are all witnesses of this.

David was a prophet, and indeed, he acknowledged that a great descendant would arise a thousand years after him, and that God would place him on the throne. David himself was a king, so it is only natural that his descendants would be kings. However, Peter tells us that this “one of his descendants” was different from many of his descendants and was special, the one whom David himself should have called “Lord. That is Jesus. It was Jesus who was resurrected and fulfilled the promise that “He will not be thrown into Hades, nor will His body decay,” and His resurrection was significant because it pointed to the One whom David called Lord.

2:33 So Jesus was raised to the right hand of God and received from the Father the Holy Spirit of promise and poured it out on us. This is as you have presently seen and heard.

2:34 For David did not go up to heaven. For he himself said: “Thus saith the Lord unto my Lord, I have come up to thee, and I will not depart from thee,

2:35 Sit at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.

2:36 Therefore know this, all the house of Israel. For God has established this Jesus whom you crucified as Lord and Christ.

The fact that Jesus was resurrected and returned to heaven, where God the Father is, is exactly what led to the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the fact that the Holy Spirit fell at that time is nothing but proof that Jesus is the Lord and Savior Christ.

2:36 Therefore, all the house of Israel, take heed to this matter. For God has established this Jesus whom you crucified as Lord and Christ.

2:37 When the people heard this, they were deeply moved, saying to Peter and the other apostles, “Brethren, what shall we do?

2:38 And Peter answered, “Repent. Repent, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and you will receive the Holy Spirit. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The remorse that we had arrogantly and irreverently killed such a man by hanging him on the cross, and that we had agreed with and supported him, sharply pricked the hearts of many people.

Peter's declaration in response to that confession was wonderful.

2:38 Then Peter answered, "Repent! And be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ so that each one of you may receive the forgiveness of sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Now all you need is repentance. Not only repent, but repent and be converted. Turn your hearts around, turn your hearts to God, and start anew. Be baptized, washed and washed by the Lord's atonement that will bring forgiveness of sins. Then you too will receive a wonderful gift from God. That is God's pure spirit, the Holy Spirit. God the Holy Spirit, the Helper, the Mediator, will live in your heart.

John 4:13 Jesus answered the woman and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will also be watered.

4:14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst: but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a fountain, and shall bring forth water unto everlasting life.

John 7:37 On the last day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "Whoever winks, let him come to me and drink.

7:38 Whoever believes in me, as it is written in the Scriptures, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water.

This was said in reference to the Spirit that those who believe in Jesus are about to receive.

2:39 This promise is given to all who are called of our Lord God, to you, and to your children, and to all who are afar off.

2:40 And Peter testified in many other words, exhorting them, saying, "Be saved from this crooked age.

2:41 And those who received the word of his exhortation were baptized, and there were about three thousand who joined them that day.

2:42 And they kept the doctrine of the apostles, and had fellowship of believers, and broke bread together, and prayed together.

Repent, be baptized, and receive the Holy Spirit as a gift. This is spoken to you and to those who are far away. It is given with or without scope to those who have been absent-minded

until now, no matter how

These are crooked times. The word “crooked” means dishonest, phony, deceitful, wicked, unrepentant, obstinate, obstinate, dishonest, dishonest, and deceitful. It may refer to this very era. How can there be happiness and peace where the winds of this age run rampant? How can we be saved from this crooked and evil age? It is only through Jesus' atonement and forgiveness of sins, “Repent, and be reconciled to God. And I ask that each one of you repent of your sins and be forgiven of your sins.

We thank you that we are saved from the crooked times and that we are led in your Word to be saved and walk in life and blessings.
